2025 ELCA Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly

The Southeastern Minnesota Assembly met at the Mayo Clinic Health System Event Center in Mankato on Friday and Saturday May 30 and 31, 2025. The Assembly was attended by 418 delegates and visitors with roughly two-thirds being lay delegates from the 165 congregations of the Synod. Pastor Sarah Walker Brown, Willa Holger, and Dave Holger were voting delegates from the United Lutheran Parish.

The theme of the Assembly was “Remember what God has done, prepare for what God will do” and this theme carried throughout the worship message as well as the keynote sessions led by Dr. Michael Chan from Concordia College, Moorhead. The scripture foundation for the theme was Psalm 77:11 “I will call to mind the deeds of the Lord; I will remember your wonders of old.”

The Assembly began at 2:00 pm on Friday, May 30, 2025, with an opening plenary session including the re-election of Bishop Regina Hassanally to serve a second six-year term. Bishop Hassanally received 92 percent of the votes on the first ballot. The afternoon plenary continued with the first keynote presentation by Dr. Michael Chan on Psalm 77. The afternoon session concluded with a worship service led by Bishop Hassanally and included a strong and inspiring message from Bishop Patricia Lull of the Saint Paul Area Synod of the ELCA. Approximately \$20,000 was raised through the offering and prior gifts from congregations and individuals. The offering will be used to fund Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota and all of the Synod’s ministry partners including Luther Seminary, ELCA Region 3 (Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota) Archives, Crossroads Campus Ministry (Mankato), Lutheran Campus Center (Winona), Good Earth Village, Lutheran Advocacy – MN, Minnesota Council of Churches, and Continuous Growth Pathways (continuing education and support program for pastors in collaboration with Gustavus Adolphus College).

The Assembly reconvened at 8:30 am on Saturday, May 31 and the second plenary session included several reports and routine business actions, approval of a budget that was similar to that of last year, and a second presentation by Keynote Speaker Dr. Michael Chan on Isaiah 43.

Following a break for lunch, plenary session three was convened and three resolutions were introduced and passed unanimously by the Assembly. The full text of all resolutions may be found on the Synod website (semnsynod.org). A report from ELCA Churchwide was given by Nick Kiger, Director for Mission Support of the ELCA. A third presentation by Dr. Chan was given on Deuteronomy.

Dr. Chan is the Vice President for Mission and Inclusion and Old Testament scholar at Concordia College, Moorhead and is well-known for his Old Testament scholarship and interpretation. He is a very dynamic and inspirational speaker who substantially enhanced everyone's understanding of the contexts and messages of the three passages from the Old Testament covered in his keynote presentations. In particular, he discussed how these messages to the people of God were reminding them of what God has done for them and to give them hope that God is still with them. He further illustrated that God does not always provide the solution to a problem or resolve a difficult situation in the way we hope or expect, but that sometimes God moves us forward in new ways to better outcomes than expected. The bottom-line message is that we need to remember that God has been there for believers in the past and that we must have faith and prepare for what God will do in the future.

In the elections held in the afternoon of the Assembly, Lisa Dierks was re-elected Vice President of the Synod, Dave Holger was elected to the Synod Council, Ed Taylor from Lanesboro was re-elected to the Synod Council, Rev. Jackie Short from Highland Prairie was elected to the Synod Committee on Discipline, Burton Svendsen from Rushford was confirmed as a delegate to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, and Pastor Sarah continues in her role as Co-Dean of the Root River Conference. Dave Holger became chair of the Synod Committee on Reference and Counsel and continues to serve as a lay member of the Synod Committee on Discipline. The Root River Conference continues to be well-represented on Southeastern Minnesota ELCA Synod Committees.

The 2025 Synod Assembly was an inspirational and informative experience for all participants. It was gratifying for the United Lutheran Parish delegates to interact with the Synod's partner representatives, as well as with Synod staff. Representatives from Good Earth Village and Lutheran Campus Center (Winona) were very complementary of their interactions with Pastor Sarah and United Lutheran Parish. Synod leadership and staff were also very complementary about Pastor Sarah's leadership of our congregation and her engagement with the Root River Conference and Synod. For a small parish we are well thought of and visible within the Synod.

The Southeastern Minnesota Synod of the ELCA includes over 117,000 baptized members in 165 congregations. The five Conferences of the Synod are the Blue Earth River Conference, the Cannon River Conference, the Minnesota River Conference, the Root River Conference, and the Zumbro River Conference. The Synod is one of 65 synods that make up the ELCA. Partner organizations of the Synod that are financially supported by the synod through mission support dollars are: Crossroads Campus Ministry, Mankato; Good Earth Village, Spring Valley; Luther Seminary, St. Paul; Minnesota Council of Churches, Minneapolis; ELCA Region 3 Archives; Lutheran Advocacy – Minnesota; Lutheran Campus Center, Winona. STEWARDSHIP SERVICE PROJECT

July-August-September stewardship project will focus on providing "SCHOOL KITS" for Lutheran World Relief. We invite all individuals and families in our community to participate. Arendahl and North Prairie WELCAs will collect and deliver to LWR drop off sites in-October. YOU CAN CHOOSE to assemble any of these kits throughout the year and/or give a monetary donation to help with shipping cost overseas.



Education is important to every community, especially where poverty or disaster has limited the options for young people to reach their potential. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children – and in some cases adults – continue learning despite the hardships they face. That learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities.

EVERYONE IS WELCOME TO DONATE. KITS WILL BE SHIPPED IN OCTOBER.

Items need to be at the churches by SUNDAY, September 28th for packing in boxes.

Box drop off will be Saturday, October 11th, 7 am – 11 am; LaCrosse, WI

Include the following items in each School Kit:

4 – 70 sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper; No loose-leaf paper

1 – 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other 1 pencil sharpener

1 pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades works well) 5

unsharpened # 2 pencils with erasers, secure together with a rubber band

5 black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band 1

box of 16 or 24 crayons

1 – 2 ½" eraser

(NP and ARENDAHL have some extra drawstring bags from last year) -----

1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14"x17" with shoulder straps no standard backpacks); recommended fabrics include sturdy cotton, canvas, denim, and twill.

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

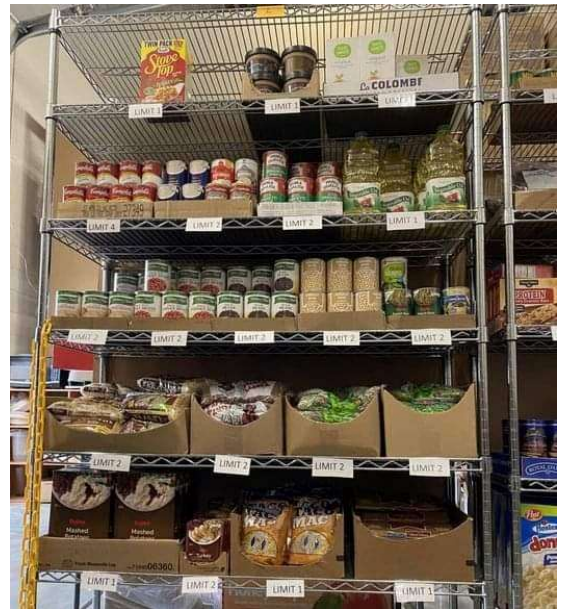
